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Do returns to education depend on how and whom you ask?

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Highlights

- Estimates of the returns to education vary according to questionnaire design, but not according to who reports the information.
- The differences are substantial: 5 percentage points higher among the most highly educated men and 16 percentage points higher among the least well educated women.
- These differences are similar in magnitude to the bias in ordinary least squares estimation and to the differences by gender, educational attainment, and sectors.



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
