ABSTRACT

Background:

Comorbidity of bipolar disorder (BD) and obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) has received clinical attention. However, the detailed nature and nosologic validity of the comorbidity have not been fully explored. This study investigated the comorbidity rate, clinical nature, and correlates of OCD in patients with BD.

Methods:

Patients (n = 314) with BD were recruited and lifetime clinical characteristics were evaluated
