Abstract

Although bullying victimization has been linked to a number of behavioral and emotional problems among adolescents, few studies have examined the mechanism through which bullying victimization affect non-suicidal self-injury. The objectives of this study were to examine the effect of bullying victimization on non-suicidal self-injury and the mediating effect of depressive symptoms on the relationship between bullying victimization and non-suicidal self-injury among adolescents. Data for this study came from the *interRAI Child and Youth Mental Health* dataset. A total of 1,650 adolescents aged 12-18 years (M = 14.56; SD = 1.79; 54.2% males) were analyzed. Binary logistic and Poisson regression models were conducted to identify the mediating effect of depressive symptoms on the relationship between bullying victimization and non-suicidal self-injury. Of the 1,650 adolescents examined, 611 representing 37% engaged in
