32 **Abstract**

33 A 51-year old male patient presented with lower abdominal pain persisting since about one  
34 year. Abdominal computed tomography scan showed a solid tumor interpreted as urachal  
35 carcinoma with peritoneal carcinomatosis. Histopathological examination revealed urachal  
36 abscess. Awareness of clinical signs and imaging findings of this rare but characteristic  
37 condition may avoid emotional distress of patients associated with erroneous suspicion of  
38 malignancy.

40 A 51-year old male patient presented with lower abdominal pain persisting since  
41 about one year. Few months earlier, sigma diverticulitis was suspected and treated
